SURGICAL SKILLS TRANSFER COURSES (STCs) - \$5,000+

STCs are physician-developed and physician-led hands-on wet labs or interactive workshops that offer instruction, demonstration, discussion and simulation of surgical, diagnostic and management techniques. The STCs provide an ideal venue for practicing ophthalmologists to hone surgical techniques, receive extensive one-on-one training with physician experts in their field, and ultimately integrate new treatments into their practice.

Now in their 10th year, COS is planning to host seven (7) STCs over the course of three (3) days. These award-winning courses host upwards of 150 participants and bring together nearly 100 physician faculty members to collaborate and share knowledge. STC topics are determined by insight from physician leaders, coupled with evaluations that highlight perceived and unperceived needs with the goal of identifying gaps in knowledge, skills, performance, clinical care or health outcomes. They are designed to be accredited for Section 3 MOC Simulation Credits.

Generous financial and in-kind contributions are crucial to the continued success of the STCs. All financial contributions will be used to off-set the high overhead cost associated with developing and delivering these world-class courses.
