## Poster Design

Strong posters focus on communicability, scientific communication and scientific merit/value. Keep the following items in mind when designing your poster:

- Title and author names are easily identifiable
- Research question, background, methods, results, discussion and conclusion are relevant, logical and linked to one another
- Innovative research, rigorous methods and conclusions supported by results
- Engaging, clear and eye catching poster design
- Formatting is appropriate and logical; graph and tables are clear and easily visible
- Clear information that can be read in 3-4 minutes
