This will be a three-year, renewable appointment and does not confer eligibility for tenure.

Job Duties

The successful candidate must demonstrate aptitude and interest in pursuing academic studies (i.e., clinical and/or basic research), provide medical and surgical cornea care, including stem cell transplantation, and must also contribute to teaching.

The incumbent must also possess a strong background and proficiency in health care management. This individual will be called upon to take a leading role in future departmental projects such as telemedicine and advanced surgical techniques.

The successful candidate will join a dynamic group of dedicated subspecialists and caring professionals who work to transform our care services to better respond to the needs of our patients. Encouraging career development by supporting our department members' areas of special interest is an important part of our mandate. - Bilingual language skills (French and English) are preferred, or a commitment to acquire the necessary language skills to practice medicine in Quebec. Candidates should be able to interact in English and in French with patients, families and health care professionals.
